#### UK wind facts

The UK is presently the best market in the world for offshore wind energy due to its favourable combination of wind resources and strong offshore regime.

- Installed offshore capacity: 5.1 GW covering 27 projects and 1465 turbines
- Projects with consented: 11.94 GW

Round 3 will develop across nine zones. The capacity of the leases issued is 32 GW. Together with Round 1 and 2, the addition of Round 3 will mean that over 45GW of sites are currently being brought forward in the UK. At the same time the government and the industry are working to bring down cost of energy and innovate the delivery of these significant projects.
